

SIX INDIA TEAMS WIN WALMART'S GLOBAL TECHATHON

Walmart Global Tech hosted its first ever Global Techathon last month. The e-tail giant's employees formed teams to create innovative solutions around one of six themes, in 24 hours. The themes were cashierless stores, cloud & data, food value chain, blockchain, voice & conversational AI, and last mile delivery. 279 teams participated, and teams from the India centre were the winners in all six categories.

HANDLING AGE RESTRICTIONS

➤ **Team Access Denied won in the cashierless stores category.** They worked on the problem of dealing with customers buying age-restricted items like alcohol from cashierless stores.

➤ The team proposed using **biometric fingerprint verification** to confirm customer eligibility. The solution involved using fingerprint scanners present on smartphones. For those who don't have devices with this feature, the team proposed using in-store fingerprint scanners.

➤ The idea was to **directly integrate the solution with the scan and go app**, which means existing IT infrastructure will be able to handle the load. It will be quick and seamless, without affecting the customer experience.

HANDHOLDING DRIVERS

➤ **Team Binary Babas won in the last mile delivery category.** They worked on Walmart's Spark Driver App, which allows drivers to accept orders for delivery. It was built to help people earn money on their own schedule.

➤ The solution proposed was a feature called More for Less. Here, truck drivers can set personal target earnings, and the feature would **handhold the driver to achieve the target in minimum time** by recommending orders with high profitability scores.
